



About the Kama'āina of the Year Award

Historic Hawai'i Foundation (HHF) annually honors individuals or organizations that have contributed to preserving Hawaii's rich history. The Kama'āina of the Year™ event furthers HHF's mission to preserve and encourage the preservation of historic buildings, objects, sites, and communities. The Kama'āina of the Year benefit is HHF's annual fundraising event and accounts for a substantial portion of its annual operating budget.

The 28th annual Kama'āina of the Year event is scheduled for Saturday, September 26, 2015, at 6 p.m. at the Royal Hawaiian Hotel. The event includes a cocktail hour, dinner, tribute to the honoree and musical entertainment. It is typically attended by 500-550 people.

About the Honoree

Neil J. Hannahs will be honored as the 2015 Kama'āina of the Year in recognition of his efforts to establish land management practices in Hawaii that include care and sustainable use of cultural, natural and water resources using a culturally-based approach to community engagement. As director of the land assets division of Kamehameha Schools, he has facilitated the transformation of its land management program from an economically-driven plan to a holistic strategy that incorporates native Hawaiian land use and cultural practices to manage natural resources and create sustainable systems to produce food, renewable energy and timber resources that also support community-based economic development and native Hawaiian social enterprise. Neil's vision has led to the restoration of He'eia fishpond on O'ahu and Keauhou Ranch on the Big Island.
