

### Place Names and Wahi Pana (Storied Places)

- Nu‘uanu (“cool height”) also “Nukuanu” (“cool pass”)
- Pu‘u Lanihuli (“where the heavens change”)
- Pu‘u Kōnāhuanui (“large, fat innards”)
- Luakaha (“place of relaxation”)
- Makuku (hill, stream, and heiau)
- Kahapa‘akai (“salt place”)
- Waolani (“heavenly forested area”)
- Kaniakapupu (Royal residence— “the singing of the land snails”)
- Hānaiakamalama (Royal residence— “adopted child of the light or moon”)
- Ahiupu‘u (“hill of fire”)
- Kawānanakoa (“the fearless prophecy”)
- Village of Kou (settlement at the Nu‘uanu Stream Mouth)
- Kawa and Kuwili Fishponds (feeding royalty)
- Pākākā (“low and broad” or Pā Kākā “courtyard for smiting”) religious and political compound at foot of Fort Street at Honolulu Harbor— Luakini heiau
