HISTORIC HAWAI'I FOUNDATION MISSION STATEMENT

he purpose of the foundation shall be to preserve and encourage the preservation of historic buildings, objects, communities, and sites relating to the history of Hawai'i; to promote awareness of and respect for all that is historically significant and architecturally distinctive in our State; and through these efforts, to keep alive and intact for the enrichment of present and future generations the inherent beauty of the Hawaiian Islands and its unique historic role in the development of the Pacific Basin.



PRESIDENT'S REPORT

he past year has been a rewarding one for preservation in Hawai'i, and for the Historic Hawai'i Foundation.

We have seen a number of "firsts" achieved as we've moved into new areas of preservation policy and programs. Late last year we were fortunate in achieving our first preservation easement; its on the house of artist Jean Charlot in Honolulu. This historic preservation easement allows HHF to act as the "historic preservation steward" on a significant piece of property which was given to the University of Hawai'i at Manoa by the Charlot heirs. The easement specifies that HHF oversee the preservation of the historic site. A preservation easement is just one important tool that can help property owners in preserving important buildings or sites in Hawai'i.

HHF has also been working with various governmental agencies to provide tax incentives for commercial property owners who wish to preserve their historic structures. We expect movement on this effort in the next few months.

This past year HHF executive director David Scott has teamed with the National Trust for Historic Preservation in working with the Navy on the redevelopment

plans for Ford Island. 

We were busy planning our annual Statewide Historic Preservation Conference that would be held in Lahaina, Maui, in June. Executive Director David Scott attended a National Trust Statewide Partners meeting in Georgia in February.

March brought a members' tour of Kalaupapa and our annual sponsorship of the "Experts at the Palace" lecture series. Nominations were requested for our annual Preservation Honor Awards that were presented in May.

Our Annual Meeting was held April 26 at Washington Place where we listened to a presentation on the plans for that beautiful historic home's restoration.

Fourteen projects received recognition through our annual Historic Preservation Honor Awards. The highlight was honoring Barnes Riznik for his lifetime of preservation activities with a special Governor's Award.

Historic Hawai'i Foundation brought noted preservation specialist Jack Williams, as the keynote speaker at the annual Statewide Historic Preservation Conference. A past president of the National Alliance of Preservation Commissions, he talked about ways to strengthen our cultural resource commissions and develop updated design guidelines for historic districts. Historic Hawai'i was to bring Williams back to Hawai'i for subsequent workshops with the Kaua'i Cultural Resource Commission and the Maui Cultural Resource Commission.

Historic Hawai'i Foundation continues to work with the military services in assisting in the preservation of our important historic resources on military bases in

Hawaiʻi. In June the National Trust for Historic Preservation listed Ford Island at Pearl Harbor as one of America's 11 Most Endangered Historic Places. In an effort to work with the Navy to preserve that very important site, the Historic Hawai'i Foundation and the National Trust brought in a Heritage Advisory Team to look at Ford Island and to recommend appropriate development. Team members gave a presentation to the Navy and to potential private developers and continue to work with all the parties to see that the "Gettysburg battlefield of the Second World War" is saved for future generations.

2001 saw the establishment of 'Ike 'Āina, a statewide land trust to assist in the preservation of native Hawaiian sites and cultural practices. HHF received a \$25,000 grant from the Nathan Cummings Foundation to facilitate the development of this independent 501(c)3 organization.

We continued to sponsor land preservation workshops on the neighbor islands to assist landowners and the general public in finding ways to preserve historic lands and land uses.

We received our first historic preservation easement, with the donation from the heirs of artist Jean Charlot to the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, of a protective covenant on the artist's house in Kahala. With this tool, we can assure that the exterior and interior features that make the house unique will be preserved and maintained.

David Scott attended the National Trust for Historic Preservation's Annual Conference in Providence, Rhode Island. Besides attending workshops and lectures he met with the Statewide Partners to continue efforts to strengthen the preservation movement. While on the East Coast, Scott was able to join a preservation consultant team and traveled to Baracoa, Cuba.

The year ended with another successful Winter Benefit. We honored the Sheraton Moana Surfrider Hotel in recognition of its 100 anniversary. Sharing the Kama'āina of the Year honors were Kyo-ya Company, Ltd. The benefit was a fine tribute to the "First Lady of Waikiki."

REAL PROPERTY PRESERVATION COMMITTEE REPORT

or the past year, the committee has worked to identify specific properties that need preservation and draft and advocate laws that will create economic incentives to protect the historic jewels of the state. Listed below are some of the initiatives from the last 12 months.

1. Historic Property Tax Reductions:

Some of Honolulu's most historic structures are office buildings. And unlike historic homes, there is no city tax incentive to protect these commercial structures. To remedy this problem, the committee conceived, drafted, introduced and lobbied for a measure that would reduce the City property tax on historic commercial properties. In summary, this measure would tax a commercial building that is listed on the Hawai'i State Register of Historic Places at its current floor area rather than the density of another building that would be allowed by the zoning code. This tax break would be allowed only in return for a commitment from the owner to maintain and protect the historic nature of the structure and grounds of the property. The Bill has been introduced as Bill 102 (2001) and is pending decision-making before the City Council Budget Committee.

2. Economic Stimulus

A measure has been introduced before the City Council, Bill 96 (2001), that would provide property tax incentives for new construction to stimulate the economy. Historic Hawai'i was concerned that such a measure would encourage the demolition of some of Honolulu's historic structures. The committee drafted an

amendment to the bill to make the construction tax incentives available only if sites eligible for listing on the Hawai'i State Register of Historic Places are protected. This measure is also pending in the Council's Budget committee.

3. Protect Historic Māhā'ulepū on Kaua'i.

To the East of Po'ip \bar{u} resort on the south side of Kaua'i is the wild coast line of Māhā'ulep \bar{u} .

The Committee coordinated a presentation to the Board of Trustees on the need to preserve and protect the historic and natural resources of this unique area. We drafted and the Board approved, a resolution calling on the landowner, Kaua'i County and the State to work to find an economically viable way to preserve this precious area and offering our assistance. Discussions are on-going between the landowner, government and community advocates to protect Māhā'ulepū.

4. Protecting Specific Historic Properties

Historic Sugar Mills Initiative

The committee worked to preserve the last architectural reminders of Hawai'i's plantation past. We identified old mills and mill towns that need protection and are offering our support to landowners in finding creative ways to save the structures and plantation lifestyles. Some of these treasures are:

- Pa'auilo Town, Big Island
 A series of meetings has been held with the landowner and plans are being developed to preserve as much as possible of the plantation town's historic structures. The committee believes that Pa'auilo is the most intact old plantation town in the State. Preserving it will continue to be a focus of our work.
- Grove Farm properties on Kaua'i and Pioneer Mill, Lahaina, Maui
 The committee contacted the landowners of these properties to offer assistance in preserving these historic resources.

Historic Homes

The committee also identified and worked to preserve the following residential structures.

- Washington Place, downtown Honolulu We reviewed the preservation plan proposed by the Governor's staff, toured the home and provided written support for creating a new home for the Governor behind Washington Place and converting the upstairs of the historic home into a museum.
- Marks Estate, Nu'uanu, O'ahu The committee continues to monitor the State's attempt to sell this historic Nu'uanu home and assure its preservation.
- Hedemann Estate, Maunawili, Oʻahu This historic home on the fringe of the Luana Hills golf course is at risk of abandonment and decay. The Kailua Historical Society will spearhead efforts to save the home.
- Allen Estate, Kailua-Kona, Hawai'i Site of the former homes of Kamehameha I and the Thurston family has been sold to Paul Allen. The committee is offering our assistance to the new owner in protecting its historic resources.
- Bond Estate, North Kohala, Hawai'i This former missionary home and school are being turned into a retreat. The Committee is working with the owner and restoration contractors to assure the sensitive restoration of this property listed on both the State and National Register of Historic Places.


