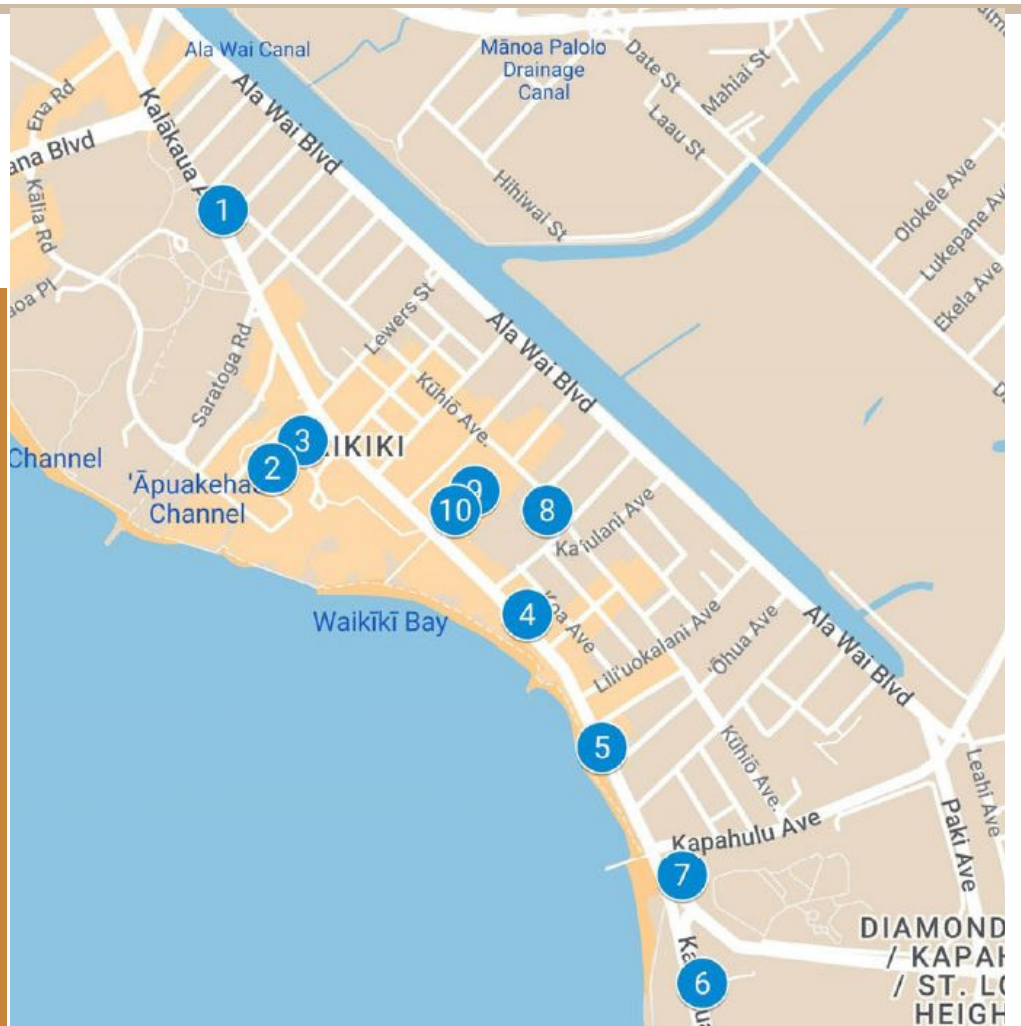


**STATUES OF
